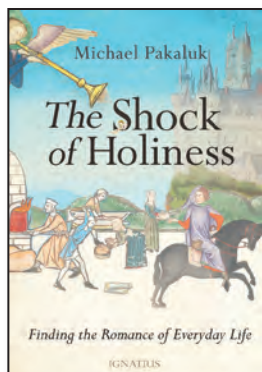
Death in Black and White: A Novel

In the latest novel by Michael O'Brien, all of North America is plunged into crisis as basic communications and other services suddenly and inexplicably fail. A disparate group of people, some of them children, most of them strangers, come together from several directions. Moved by grace and dreams, they leave behind all security and follow the thread of inspiration, seeking refuge in the mountains of Canada. Their choice to proceed in blind faith has consequences that will be revealed only in the distant future.

Canadian bookseller Alex Graham is a middle-aged widower whose quiet life is turned upside down when his college-age son disappears without any explanation or trace of where he has gone. With minimal resources, the father begins a long journey that takes him for the first time away from his safe and orderly world.
