





JANE AUSTEN

Mansfield Park. It unerringly displays the depth of Austen's wisdom, especially in her understanding of the spiritual, psychological, and cultural complexities of morality.

Pride and Prejudice. This is arguably the finest, and certainly the most popular, of Austen's novels. 




