A Message from Fr. Joseph Fessio, S.J.

Dear Friend of Ignatius Press,

Do you soon forget what you read?

So do I. And usually very quickly.

So why continue reading if all or most is soon forgotten?

I think a comparison can help to answer that question. Spiritual nourishment has much in common with physical nourishment. We enjoy a well-prepared, good meal. A glass or two of wine makes it even more enjoyable. And we try to eat healthy foods, cut down on carbs, maybe add some nutritional supplements. Then what? The body doesn't absorb it all. But where is what is absorbed? We don't know. (For many of us we do know where a lot of it goes: around the mid-section.)

What we do know is that it goes somewhere, it's part of what and who we are, and without it we would languish and then die. And so we continue to eat regularly. We're nourished. But we can't correlate specifically what we eat with what we are as a result.

Reading is similar. We can enjoy what we read and learn many things—even when reading fiction. But then we forget. Still, what we read becomes part of us, it shapes us, forms us. We may not be able to correlate specific details of what we read (though sometimes we can) with our way of looking at the world and those around us. Or with our relationship with God. But our attitudes are changed, or reinforced, often subtly, by our reading. And, as with eating, if we neglect it we wither.

I am reminded of this in a particular way as the year 2024 unfolds. We are facing major world-changing events, perhaps catastrophic ones: war in Ukraine, Israel, and the Middle East; severe economic challenges; political unrest and conflict. It's easy to be caught up in the "things of this world", important as they are.

But we don't stop eating. And we shouldn't stop reading. Especially reading that reminds us of the "permanent things" amid the maelstrom of current events.

So prepare yourselves for a feast of inspiring, nourishing reading. This catalogue is your menu. (And remember, unlike with eating, you can't "over-read".)


The Detransition Diaries **E**

We live in unprecedented times, when what was known for thousands of years, that we are created male and female, is now up for debate. It is now controversial to see that sex is binary, that a man can never become a woman, nor a woman a man. We are witnessing a rapid rise in gender confusion among young people, especially among young women and girls.

The Detransition Diaries is both personal and historical. It is personal in that it recounts the stories of five women and two men who felt they were born in the wrong body and believed the lie they were told by peers, teachers, and medical professionals that they could be their “true” selves by medically and surgically altering their bodies to match the opposite sex. Their stories describe the short- and long-term harm that so-called gender-affirmative medicine did to their mental and physical health.

The book closes with an analysis on how



this dark chapter in medical abuse might end and what is needed for medicine to regain its obligation to do no harm.



This acclaimed biography chronicles the amazing life of St. Frances Cabrini (1850–1917), an Italian–American nun who became the first naturalized citizen of the United States to be canonized as a saint by the Roman Catholic Church. The book traces Cabrini’s journey from her humble beginnings in Italy to her heroic mission in the USA and South America to serve the poor by establishing schools, hospitals, and orphanages.



Theodore Maynard presents a compelling and authoritative biography of this modern saint. He has drawn his material directly from the Vice–Postulator of her cause for sainthood, from the original records of her life, and from interviews granted to him by members of her religious order who had a close relationship with her.

Maynard delves into Cabrini’s tireless efforts to help immigrants in the United States, her work with the poor and sick in South America, and her establishment of a religious order, the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, dedicated to serving those in great need. Born in Northern Italy, Mother Cabrini was a woman of boundless compassion, courage and energy. Inspired by

her deep faith in Jesus Christ, she saw her life as a mission to relieve suffering and serve those in need—in particular the poor and excluded.

This book is being released to coincide with a major motion picture on the life of Mother Cabrini that will be released in theaters across the USA in March, 2024.


What Do You Seek? *Encountering the Heart of the Gospel*

This basic message of the Gospel—the Good News of Jesus Christ—is known as the kerygma, which is based on the Greek word kerysso, meaning herald or one who proclaims. This kerygma was the core message that each of the Apostles, as a herald of the Gospel, proclaimed to the world.

This is why the Catholic Church emphasizes the importance of what it calls “First Proclamation”—the first proclamation of the kerygma. Announcing the core Gospel message of God’s love and the person and mission of Jesus Christ is called First Proclamation because it is ordinarily meant to come before the more in–depth, systematic presentation of the deeper mysteries of the Faith.

When introducing someone to Christian–




ity, it is usually best to start with the simple message that God loves you, has a plan for your happiness and wants you to share in his love. And even though we turned away from him in sin, he still seeks us out and wants to be reunited with us. He even became one of us in Jesus Christ—to forgive us, heal us and restore us to relationship with the Father.


Unfortunately, many Catholics today do not know the basic outline of that

Gospel message, or are not confident sharing it with others. So this book focuses on the kerygma—that basic, core Gospel message that is at the foundation of everything we believe and do as Catholics. The aim is to help us enter more deeply into the Gospel, to ponder the mysteries of God’s love for us and his work of salvation.



Over the past decade Rome has been marked with sharp, and often unwarranted, criticism of the Church in the United States and American Catholic life. But very few of the critics have taken the time to talk, systematically, with a wide range of U.S. Catholics to understand their concerns. *True Confessions* is unique for its frank and in-depth interviews with 103 bishops, clergy, religious, and lay men and women from various backgrounds.

and the testimony of immigrant Americans as they assess their new homeland.



Madeleine Delbrêl

French poet, social worker, and lay missionary Madeleine Delbrêl (1904–1964) knew that Christ’s unspeakable goodness touches the smallest, most forgotten corners of our everyday world—the laundry, the checkout counter, the commute. His word shines before us “while we walk in the street, while we do our work, while we peel our vegetables, while we wait for a phone call, while we sweep our floors. 

While many Catholics are aware of great female saints such as Catherine of Siena and Thérèse of Lisieux, a view persists that




The Life of Cardinal Francis E. George, O.M.I.

Cardinal Francis E. George, O.M.I., was an exemplary pastor and heroic disciple of Christ. A native Chicagoan, he was told as a young man that he would never be a priest in Chicago because of a physical disability resulting from polio. He went on to be ordained a priest with the Oblates of Mary Immaculate in 1963. The native son was appointed as archbishop of Chicago in 1997, created a cardinal in 1998, and

served in Chicago until 2014, just months before his death in April 2015.

Cardinal George was a prophetic voice in the Church—a man able to see things as they are and from



the point of view of the whole Church. His episcopal motto, “To Christ be glory in the Church,” encapsulates his legacy, because every decision he made, every action he took, every suffering he endured was about serving others and pointing them to our Savior.

The many and far-reaching topics that Keefe addressed are arranged in the book under a series of chapter headings that are intended to provide an overview of the content of Catholic theology—from Christology to

Mariology to Ecclesiology. The result will be to convey the rich and varied fruit of a gifted mind, but also, it is hoped, some sense of the man himself.







The Crisis of Western Education

Christopher Dawson

The Crisis of Western Education, originally published in 1961, served as a capstone of Christopher Dawson's thought on the Western educational system.

Dawson argued that Western culture had become increasingly defined by a set of economic and political preoccupations ultimately hostile to its larger spiritual end. Inevitably, its educational systems also became increasingly technological and pragmatic, undermining the long standing emphasis on liberal learning and spiritual reflection which were hallmarks of the Christian humanism that created it.

Dawson had reservations about educational initiatives that had been developed in response to this crisis of education.

Among them, he expressed doubts about newly emerging great books programs fearing that they would reduce the great tradition of a living culture to a set of central texts or great ideas. In contrast, he insisted that a Christian education had to be concerned with "how spiritual forces are transmitted and how they change culture, often in unexpected ways." This would require an understanding of the living and vital character of culture. As Dawson saw it, "culture is essentially a network of relations, and it is only by studying a number of personalities that you can trace this network." Dawson offers a diagnosis of modern education and proposes the retrieval of an organic and living culture which alone has the power to renew Western culture.


